## What to Expect

The Ohio Lake Erie Commission worked with Cleveland State University and CDM to develop a series of case studies evaluating the development feasibility of recommended stormwater best practices. The case studies compare conventional and best practices, recommended decision-making tools, and recommended streamlined review processes.



